### Discussion with local Mayors (Rebecca Thompson)

Mayor of West Chicago, Warrenville and Batavia

Q – For the mayors, what about the relationship between Fermilab and your community was the most successful and what did you value the most?

Mayor Pineda

- Glad I got to meet Nigel
- Like to see if we could get more information for our kids at every level so they can see that this is nearby and might be something they want to do in their future.
- I had the pleasure of sitting on the group that was discussing the linear collider for almost two years and I learned more about science then I ever thought I would.
- I brought Fermilab up at a city council meeting and by the time I got off Zoom three alderman expressed interest in becoming involved with the lab in some way.
- Educare starts teaching our children at six weeks old nursery 5 years prep for kindergarten so instead of being behind you are ahead. I fought long and hard for it to be here 11th program in this country and only suburban program.
- Getting students on Fermilab property would be amazing.

Mayor Brummel

- What we most appreciated from Warrenville, has been the relentless efforts to be a good community member, Fermilab has gone over and above any institution to make sure you are a positive influence and strong connection, local communities always got noticed, kept informed, very very good neighbor
- The open spaces and stewardship of those areas are very important to our citizens and appreciated

Mayor Schielke

- I am honored you asked me to comment
