Alison Markovitz introduced herself, explained her new role at Fermilab and in the LBNF/DUNE project, and provided a summary about her previous appointments.

Chris Mossey provided an overview of recent LBNF/DUNE milestones (see presentation):

- Groundbreaking ceremony for construction of caverns at Sanford Lab
- Award of contract to Kiewit/Alberici Joint Venture for LBNF preconstruction services
- Growth of DUNE collaboration, which now has 1,000+ members
- Announcement that UK will make contributions worth \$88 million to LBNF/DUNE
- Start of assembly of DUNE prototype particle detectors at CERN

He also showed the economic impact video that Fermilab create for stakeholders in Illinois and South Dakota.

Arlene Hawks informed CAB members that SciTech plans numerous events and activities to celebrate the museum's 30-year anniversary.
